Deer Class Topics

Our topic for this half term is 'Where I live'. We will be exploring our environments and looking closely at the buildings, houses and materials.

In English we will be looking at Recounts and telling stories. We will be look at the various features of stories and using puppets or props to act them out. We will continue to practice reading and phonics sounds. Our main stories this term will be:

- Goldilocks and the three bears
- A piece of Cake by Jill Murphy
- The three little pigs
- · Little red riding hood

In Mathematics, we will be learning about Data Handling. We will be looking at how to sort objects and pictures using different criteria and attempting to build pictograms as a class.

We will continue to use lots of sensory trays, independent tasks and equipment to support the learning needs of our children.

To continue these topics with your child at home, here are some ideas that you could use to help;

- Look at objects and rooms around your house and discuss their use.
- Sort household items into groups e.g. cutlery, socks, cushions etc.

Continue practising with reading words. Children should have words in their yellow reading diaries. Please let me know if the words have gone missing, or you would like some more.
