Owl Class Topics

Key Stage One's topic for this half term is 'shopping'. We will walk to the local co-op to buy ingredients to decorate our Gingerbread man. We will also visit a local supermarket. Children will have the opportunity to role play shopping in class using concepts from Maths and English to support their learning.

In English we will be looking at stories with familiar settings. We will be using a lot of role play scenarios to practice and enhance speaking and listening skills and sequencing stories we have read.

We will continue to practice reading our key words and continue to learn new sounds in phonics.

In Mathematics we will be looking at data handling including looking at money (1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p) as well as continuing to practice our numbers.

To continue these topics with your child at home, here are some ideas that you could use to help:

- Go shopping, look at the different types of shops there are, explore where you can buy different items.
- Practice using money (1p, 2p, 5p, 10p) to buy simple things, count out the correct money to buy an item.
- Read stories with your children that have familiar settings, e.g. five minutes peace, little red riding hood.
- Try to write a shopping list at home and use it when you go shopping.
